- Barriers enhance existing doors with installation over doorframes inside of entry ways
- Barriers can be closed in one motion to create a safe room.
- Barrier's ballistic capabilities are certified to stop high velocity rifle threats by the National Institute of Justice (NIJ), the US Department of Defense, and UL 752 Standard
- Barriers easily attach to existing doorframes and can be non-invasively retrofitted intovirtually any structure.
- Barriers are secured with electro-mechanical locks which can be opened from the inside by opening a lever and from the outside with a fob or key pad.
- Barriers meet New York State fire codes.

What is the "Duty of Care?"

- Organizations are responsible for ensuring a safe environment for their personnel, clients, and visitors
- When an active shooter strikes, it is too late if the proper procedures and equipment have not been established and installed
- The Occupational Safety Health Administration ("OSHA") Act of 1970 holds employers liable for negligence if employees receive "reasonably foreseeable" injuries

Lockdown, Lockout, and Shelter In Place

- Eliminate outer perimeter entry armored ingress points prevent attackers from entering a building
- Deny access into offices and workspaces interior ballistic security barriers allow individual rooms to immediately become "safe rooms" in the event of an emergency
- Safe rooms deny attacker line of sight and shield occupants from high velocity rifle threats
- Custom solutions protect sensitive infrastructure from damage
- Negates equipment repair and/or replacement post-incident
